#### Latest news on TUM.Africa

- ➤ This is the first newsletter related to TUM activities in and for Africa. The newsletter does not pretend to be complete, but the aim is to share information which individual Chairs find important and relevant for other Chairs. The aim is also to foster inter-disciplinary and transdisciplinary cooperation and make better use of the funding opportunities which may exist, and which may help the establishment of TUM.Africa.
- ➤ A TUM.Africa roundtable discussion took place on May 14, 2018. As a first follow-up 10 Expressions of interests were assembled in response to the call by the roundtable discussions. Currently discussions are held to seek and secure funding.

- Ongoing project: NEXUS The Nexus of Water, Food and Energy. German Academic Exchange Service to TUM to develop a study program, including African partner universities in Ethiopia and Tanzania, led by Prof. P. Rutschmann, Hydraulic and Water Resources Engineering at TUM
- ► Humboldt Fellow Dr. Luke Olang from Kenia at Chair Hydrology and River Basin Management. His topic is: "Integrated Drought Risk Management in the Horn of Africa towards integrating Scientific Early Warning Systems and Local Information"
- ➤ Chair Hydrology and River Basin Management contributed to The 18th International symposium on **Sustainable Water Resources Development**, at the Arba Minch Water Technology Institute, Arba Minch University, Ethiopia. **June 8 9, 2018**

Hany Abo-El-Wafa, a researcher at the Chair for Strategic Landscape Planning and Management (TUM School of Life Sciences Weihenstephan), is investigating the impact of urbanization and urban growth on the surrounding environment of urban areas in sub Saharan Africa.

In his study, he incorporates environmental and hydrological models into an Urban Spatial Scenario Design Model (USSDM) to assess the impact of

# ► Short-term Lectureship at KNUST by the Professorship of Modeling Spatial Mobility at TUM

- ➤ On the invitation of the Director of the Road and Transportation Engineering Master's Program (RTEP) at KNUST, Dr. Matthew Okrah of the Professorship of Modeling Spatial Mobility at TUM visited KNUST as a guest lecturer in Transport Modeling between March 1 and March 31, 2018. The objective was to equip students with knowledge and skills necessary to develop models to assess proposed solutions to transport problems and support decision making in the transport sector. Over a period of four weeks, the RTEP students were introduced to the theoretical concepts in transport modeling and were trained to use the VISUM software to apply the learned concepts to develop travel demand models.
- ➤ Concept Development and realization of a workshop at the 12th IGSSE Forum in Raitenhaslach: Prof. Dr. Clarissa Prazeres da Costa and Katharina Klohe, on behalf of the Center for Global Health, together with Kathrin Schmidt from the Graduate School and Prof. Wacker, chair of Sociology of Diversity, were involved in the concept development as well as

the realization of the workshop "Forging Sustainable Research Partnerships" that was organized as part of the 12th IGSSE Forum in Raitenhaslach that took place from May 7 – 9, 2018.

The goal was to introduce and develop the idea of a One Health Summer School in Kenya for PhD students at TUM together with PhD students of partner universities in Kenya. The students were very interested in the subject area of One Health and the planning and funding of the summer school will now be tackled together with IGSSE.
